

The Riverside Range Gun Club, Inc.

Rules & Regulations

1. All firearms will be unloaded when brought into The Riverside Range Gun Club, Inc. Firearms are to be cased. Revolvers without cases will be carried by the top strap, cylinder open. Semi-autos will have the slides locked to the rear, magazines out. Long guns, when uncased, must have the action open and pointed up. If the action of a certain firearm cannot be locked open a chamber flag must be used. CCW permit holders and Law enforcement officers may carry their concealed carry handgun or duty handgun on the range loaded. If they choose to shoot that gun it must be unloaded at the firing line only while pointed downrange. The same procedures will be followed for reloading & re-holstering. ***Drawing from a holster is prohibited, other than initially UN-holstering then re-holstering a carry gun when finished shooting.***
2. Firearms may be loaded on the range only when pointed down range, at the firing line, at the assigned stall. *Firearms must not be loaded behind the firing line.*
3. Only authorized firearms and ammunition may be used. NO SHOTGUNS (or shotgun ammo). *Armor penetrating or incendiary rounds are prohibited* (We reserve the right to refuse the use of reloaded, low-quality and/or unsafe ammunition and firearms). Steel cased rifle ammunition must be hollow point or soft point. NO FMJ STEEL CASED AMMUNITION. NO GREEN TIPPED OR BLACK TIPPED AMMUNITION.
4. Use of eye and ear protection is required at all times on the range.
5. While on the range, firearms must be pointed down range at all times. *When moved from the firing line, firearms must be cased or carried as stated in Rule #1.*
6. Place finger on trigger only when firearm is aimed and ready to fire at the approved target. Dry firing is allowed on the firing line only. *Dry firing in the lobby or behind the firing line is prohibited.*
7. Should a misfire or other malfunction occur, keep the firearm pointed down range. *If required, place the firearm on the floor or shelf, at the firing line, pointed down range and obtain assistance. **DO NOT leave the firing line with a loaded or jammed firearm.***
8. Firing at other than an approved target will result in revocation of range privileges and liability for any damages (*You are responsible for any damages you may cause to the range, accidental or not.*)
9. Accidental discharge or damage must be reported to the Club as soon as possible no matter how minor they may seem. Report to Club volunteer if available or to riversiderangegunclub@gmail.com
10. Never move forward of the firing line. *If anything falls forward of the firing line contact the Club for assistance.*
11. Any unattended firearms must be in the condition listed in Rule #1.
12. No shooting from the prone position. *No firing of rifles or pistol from the prone position.*
13. **NO RAPID FIRE!** Controlled firing of rifles and pistols only. You will be charged for damages. (Class III and L.E. members must fire controlled bursts only! You will be charged for damages.)
14. Smoking is prohibited on the range.
15. The use of alcohol or drugs is prohibited on the range.

16. No drawing from a holster. (Unless special permission is granted by Club Trustees).
17. No food or drink is permitted on the range
18. *Please sweep brass downrange. If you reload, you may collect your brass from your shooting lane. All other brass helps support the range.*
19. Members may bring up to **two (2)** guests per visit. **Guests must use the same lane as the member.**
All guests must complete & sign a release/waiver form at every visit, online waivers are good for 6 months from submission date.

ATTENTION: Any member who brings a guest!

- If your guest does not fill out a release/waiver form you will have your membership revoked without refund. *Online waivers are good for 6 months from submission date.* NO EXCEPTIONS!
- If a member or guest of a member breaks any of the Club Rules & Regulations that member will have their membership revoked without refund!
